Thanks to Mr Trenberth and staff for the preparation and support on the day to ensure all students engaged well and enjoyed the experience. The interschool team is in the process of selection and training for the big carnival on Thursday 5 November. Congratulations to all for another fantastic event.

★ KINDY ORIENTATION

We are in the middle of our orientation sessions for next year's Kindergarten students and parents with a further group meeting next Tuesday. Parents meet with myself, school nurse, speech pathologist and Audrey Turner from the Child and Parent Centre. While we are meeting, the children experience time with teachers and staff in the Kindy area before parents join them for a play and to ask further questions about the Kindy program. Following these meetings, classes will be drawn up and parents informed of groupings and days to allow them to arrange work and day care. Our Kindergarten numbers are down a little on last year and I am keen to hear from any families who have not enrolled as yet for 2021. If you know of or have family or friends who will be seeking a Kindy place for next year, please encourage them to call into school to secure a place for their child.

★ 2021 UPDATE

We are currently in the process of developing a teacher pool for 2021 and once finalised will select teachers. Class structures are not yet finalised hence no teachers have been allocated to specific year levels. Our projected numbers indicate we will have fifteen classes and 3 Kindergarten groups. Parents often make requests for particular classes and where I can accommodate their request I will. Please don't hesitate to discuss your thoughts with me to consider for next year.

★ BOOK WEEK

Last Friday the children had a successful book themed dress up day with associated learning activities. Thanks to Miss Mohr and Miss Grant who coordinated the parade and prizes. This is a great way to connect children to books and reading and we thank you for your efforts to make them feel special on the day. Thanks to all those teachers and staff who entered into the spirit of Book Week.

★ COVID-19 CHANGES TO EVENTS:

As we are still under Stage 4 guidelines we have made some adjustments to coming events while maintaining your child and their interests as the guiding principle.



Wirrabirra School is an ALLERGY FRIENDLY SCHOOL. What does this mean? * Year 6 Graduation

This year we are planning to hold the Year 6 Graduation at school on the morning of Monday 14 December from 9am to 10.30am. This will allow us to have the same number of family members as previously. This will be followed by a morning tea with families and then the students will head off to the movies. We hope the early notice of this change will give families time to make work arrangements to attend. As the students are leaving school for their excursion after the Graduation Ceremony they will be required to wear their school uniforms.

* Parent Thank You Morning Tea

This year we will not hold a Parent Morning Tea given the year has drastically limited parental involvement on the school site. We do however thank all families for their support in helping us manage the ongoing and evolving COVID19 situation. In particular limiting time on site and encouraging the independence of your children to enter and leave school independently.

* Presentation Assembly

The Presentation Assembly will also have a revised format for this year with the event limited to presentation of Book Awards and Councillors for 2021. Only parents of these children will be invited to share the occasion with their children. Classes will not be presenting items this year. The Year Six students will get the opportunity to perform their Graduation item to the other students after their Graduation.

Our Pre-Primary to Year 5 students will go to the movies as normal. We will be the only school and the cinema is booked for Wirrabirra only.

* YEAR 5/6 DANCING

Dancing lessons for Year 5/6 will go ahead as per last year. Mr Knight will lead the instruction with the support of other staff hence it is an in-house event limiting any COVID 19 concerns from outside presenters.

The dates outlined above are to ensure that students who are eligible for transport assistance in 2021 are processed in a timely manner and families are notified as quickly as possible of the outcome of their application.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to term 4!

Each new term, new week, and new day provides opportunity to do something new; to make changes; and to give our all to the day at hand. We have an opportunity to live more authentically and to be the best that we can in how we treat ourselves and others. It brings new experiences in relationships, in learning, at work and at play. This term includes the 'new normal' of being under the shadow of a virus yet to be overcome. We can have empathy for those in the Eastern States, especially Victoria, who have been impacted more severely by Covid-19. 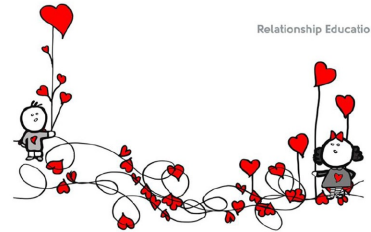


