FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents, Carers and School Community

Term Two has almost finished with just two weeks left of what has been a very busy and productive term of learning for students. The last day of term is Friday, 2 July and we commence Term Three for students on Tuesday 20 July.

★ SCHOOL REVIEW

On Tuesday Wirrabirra underwent our first School Review using the new model all Public Schools are required to carry out. The process involves us conducting a detailed review across all areas of our

teaching and learning and school operations including our work with outside groups and organisations. The evidence and plans for improvement are submitted to an external review team who then visited the school for the day and spoke with 28 staff, 6 parent and external providers and 8 students. I met with the review team at the start of the day and again when they had completed their review at the end of the day for comment and feedback prior to a report being developed that will be published for your viewing and discussion with the School Board and P&C. The initial feedback from those who participated and the reviewers was very positive and confirmed our evaluation and assessments. There were very strong statements made to me about the engagement, knowledge, understandings and passion from all those who contributed on the day including staff, students and your parent representatives. Thank you to everyone for your hard work and professional commitment to the students of Wirrabirra. We can be truly proud of our school and I look forward to sharing the final report with you.

★ CANTEEN'S FUTURE

Like many schools we have had a canteen for a very long time but are having to assess if it is still viable to operate. Like many decisions the profit and loss statements have to be considered. At the P&C Meeting on Monday a recommendation from the Canteen Committee was put to close the canteen based on ongoing financial losses. Before this decision is adopted by the P&C all financials for 2019 through to end of June this year are being reviewed and confirmed. If this audit confirms the losses the canteen will need to close.

This is very sad and no fault of our Canteen Manager Miss McBride but more the drop in lunch orders overtime and not having volunteers other than the very generous Miss Senior.

I understand this is a difficult decision and it has surfaced on social media. It is important to comment with the correct information and consider what losses a canteen can sustain without draining the P&C fund raising by the school community to support their children's learning.

★ STUDENT DISCOS

Last night the Councillors with support from many of our great teachers hosted three discos for our students as a reward for the thousands of Quinny rewards they have earned this term. Mr Knight was on the music while the student councillors led some games and fun. Thank you so much everyone for giving up your time to make the evening and discos very special for the children. The students are very lucky to have their teachers with them to dance, have fun and even selling some treats and glow sticks on the night. I was very impressed with the

★ EVENTS TO COME







We are open Tuesday to Friday


